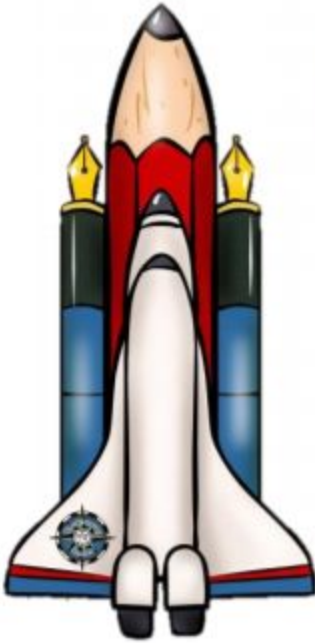

But as far as what happens between 9am and 3pm? Anything but typical.

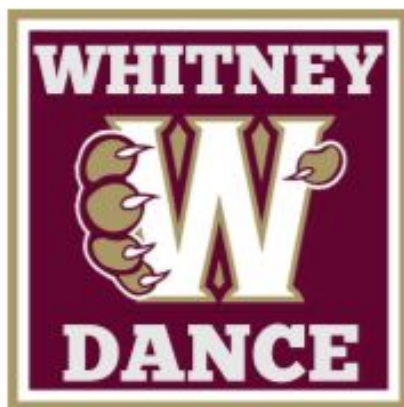
