#### REGISTRATION FEE

\$115 one player, \$230 two players, \$300 family of three or more players.

Each player is also charged a \$30 raffle ticket fee at time of registration

Register by May 21st deadline to avoid late fees and ensure placement\*

New Players - You will need to upload at time of registration a copy of your child's certified birth certificate and a recent picture. Registrations will not be accepted without this. Hospital and baptismal certificates will not be accepted.

Returning Players - You will not need to submit another birth certificate copy, if you played last season, however, an updated picture will need to be uploaded. If you skipped last season, you will need to submit another copy of your birth certificate.

Pictures: You will need to upload a jpeg 2mb or smaller headshot photo at the time of registration. Photos should be in color and no hats or sunglasses on in photo. Once you upload the image, please crop to where 85% of the child's face covers the photo.

\*\*Team placement requests may be made at time of registration. While we will do our best to accommodate requests, not all requests can or will be honored.

#### OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- If your child's birth date falls between January 1, 2000 and December 31, 2013 they are eligible to play soccer this season.
- Teams will be formed based on age, child of coach, returning player to same team, school child attends, etc.
- Practice begins in early August, and will be held at a park or school in Rocklin. Practice times, days, and locations
  will be determined by the Club. No requests honored. Players will be contacted in the last week of July directly by
  their coaches regarding practice times and locations.
- Soccer games begin in September and run through November. Most games will be played in Rocklin, Roseville, Loomis, Granite Bay and Lincoln.
- Uniforms are to be purchased by the player. The Club does not provide uniforms. Players will need to wear shinguards and soccer cleats to practices and games. Baseball and softball cleats <u>may not</u> be worn for soccer.
- Payment in full will be expected at registration. Please consult website for RYSC drop policy.
- Financial Aid may be available for those who apply.

#### \*LATE REGISTRATION

There is a <u>\$25 per player</u> late fee charged at the time of registration for any registrations after May 21st. Later Registration period runs from 5/21-6/10. A waiting list will be started for players registering 6/11-7/1.

Placement is not guaranteed for players registering in the 5/21-7/1 time frame.
