Math

We are working in Unit 2, which is all about using patterns to multiply. This is an important skill to know the reasoning behind the math facts. Keep practicing at night with MFIAF. This can be located in Home Connect.

A yellow paper was sent home with Math Strategies. I encourage you to keep this handy. This will help explain math strategies during HW time.

This and that...

- Each AR term a reading log is sent home. Each student is required to read each night for at least 20 minutes. The new reading logs are coming home soon.
